

Access levels: private, public and free data

Public, private and free data

The experimental data on OCHEM has three access levels:

- **Private data** is visible only to the user who introduced it
- **Public data** is visible to all OCHEM users
- **Free data** is visible and freely downloadable by all OCHEM users

The difference between **public** and **free** data is in the fact that OCHEM limits the export of sensitive information (in particular, molecular structures) for non-free data. Different categories of users can have individual limits for exporting non-free data.

Users can make their data public or free any time using the [Compound property browser](#) as shown on the screenshot below.

Approved data

The data published by users (**public** and **free** data as described above) can be tagged as "approved" by OCHEM moderators.

By default, users see only the approved data published by other users. However, there is an option to show all public data, including the records not yet approved by moderators.
